


Descaling a keurig with vinegar

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Just last November, Keurig Green Mountain looked unstoppable. He had a death grip on the hugely lucrative single service coffee market, announced a huge investment from Coca Cola as it developed a new machine for fizzy drinks and cold drinks, scared off the legendary hedge fund manager betting on its failure, and was about to release a machine that promised to end its pod piracy problem forever. All of which made it the most effective stock in the S-P 500 at one point. But since then consumers have strongly rejected the new car, sales have fallen, and what cold drinks machines? Late to the market, and too expensive. Shares in the company dove after earnings were released last week and then dived again after analysts got a closer look at the new car through a call with management. They were, to put it mildly, less than happy (paywall). The Keurig Kold will cost about \$300 or \$369 dollars, depending on the retailer-more-than-expected and much more expensive than even the highest end product from its competitor Sodastream, which costs \$199.99. The least expensive Sodastream machine is only \$79.99. Even at this price, Keurig will subsidize the product and lose money on each machine, hoping to make it back with pod sales. The pods will also be significantly more expensive than the Sodastream concentrate, at between 99 cents and \$1.29 per pod that makes an 8 ounce drink. Sodastream sells concentrate for \$5.99 per pack, enough to make 33 drinks. Keurig drinks will have an ounce cost of 12 to 16 cents, compared to between 1 and 2 cents for Sodastream. Analysts expect that Keurig's proposed prices will hurt sales greatly until the company brings them down by at least a third, but the fact that this subsidy machine even with this very high price tag suggests that won't happen for some time. The new machine has some advantages. It will be able to cool drinks without ice, for example, which Sodastream can not, and will not require a gas canister, as pods contain carbonation beads. It wasn't just the price that disappointed investors. The product will also not be available online until the fall, and will not be fully rolled out in retail stores until the 2016 holiday season. The company's shares saw their second sharp drop in prices in about a week on Friday. It's currently down more than 30% from its highs last year. Worse, the market that Keurig is chasing with its road and late cars may not even be that profitable. Sodastream dominates the category, and it doesn't do all that well: Keurig has had huge success becoming the one-serving coffee option of choice in America. But what drove his stock prices up was the belief that he could fight piracy with his new machine, to further cement his position in the coffee market, and that cold machines can provide a big revenue stream. None of these things seem terribly likely right now. Let's face it: None of us want to face life without our Keurig. We came to rely on this magical little machine that makes coffee at the touch of a button. But just like cleaning the oven, cleaning the dishwasher and cleaning the washing machine, you can't rely on this appliance to take care of your own cleaning and maintenance. That's bad news. But the good news is that it's generally not hard to clean Keurig, and you have different cleaning options ranging from the items that you already have in the kitchen to purchase the company's descaling solution. Here we have put together a quick and simple guide to save your coffee maker. Medium, and clean, so you can sip the espresso in a bacteria-free world. How often should Keurig be cleaned? The appearance of your Keurig should be cleaned about once a week, at least, or more often if things get heavy. Keep in mind that the tray can only hold eight ounces, so you will need to empty it every once in a while. It is recommended that the reservoir and pod holder get a weekly cleanup, but descaling - or removal of mineral buildup - can be done less frequently, about once every three to six months. Descal light tends to flip when the time has come, but you'll probably be able to say on your own anyway. Brewing can become slower and your cup can't fill all the way. As for replacing the filter, that can be done every two months or so. How to clean the outer part of Keurig? With a wet, soapy cloth free of lint, wipe off dust or spray. Then gently slip out of the drip tray, empty, wipe and return to your position. But never, ever put a car in the water. It's an electric device, after all. How to clean individual parts of Keurig? Turn off and off the machine and let it cool. Then lift the lever to disassemble the K-Cup pod holder and funnel, and wash both parts in the sink or on the top shelf of the dishwasher at a low temperature cycle. While you're at it, loosen any potential clogs from the input needle (that's the thing that pierces the pods) as well as exit the needle under the pod holder using a clean paperclip. (But beware, these things are sharp!) Remove the tank and cover and wash like soapy water in the sink, not a dishwasher. Rinse thoroughly and spray the filter with a faucet hose, or shake the tank to create a stronger flow of water. But when you're finished, don't towel dry inside as you could leave some pile behind. Lower the reservoir and, if applicable, filter. Turn off the car. Fill the tank with 10 ounces of white vinegar. Next, place a large, ceramic (no paper!) under the spout and (without adding K-Cup), hit that favorite boil button. How can I get a taste of vinegar from my Keurig? Clean this mug, then refill the tank with 10 ounces of water-only water and repeat, allowing Keurig to sit for 30 minutes when full. (Some people choose a tablespoon of baking soda, just to make sure it's very clean.) Then remove and rinse the tank, fill it to the full line of fresh water and repeat the cooking cycles until all the water disappears. Perform the above functions, but instead of using vinegar, fill the tank with a bottle of descaling Keurig solution. Before moving on to the next step, filling in now an empty descaling solution is a bottle of water and pour that into the reservoir as well. Hit the boil button to perform the cleaning to cook in a ceramic mug (remember, don't use the paper here!). Repeat to those until the water is illuminated. At this point, let Keurig rest for 30 minutes. Then remove and rinse the tank, fill it up to the full line with water, and repeat the cooking cycles until all the water disappears (or 12 times as recommended by the manufacturer Keurig Descaling Solution).
